Cicatricial pemphigoid is a relatively uncommon blistering disease that mostly affects the mucous membranes, that is, the moist linings of the mouth, the eyes, the nose and throat, and the vagina.

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The small intestine begins at the duodenum and is a tubular structure, usually between 6 and 7 m long. Focal epithelial hyperplasia (FEH) or Heck's disease is a rare contagious disease caused by human papillomavirus that was first described in 1965 from the observation of isolated or multiple soft papular and nodular eruptions on the oral mucosa of Navajo Xavante Indian and Alaska Eskimo children (1).

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
